## Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 3500 characters, including spaces)

Main research area: philosophical anthropology (emotions, action, phenomenology of religions). Other work on global justice and theory of knowledge. Lines of research:

A. *Philosophy of emotions*. The role of emotional life in the constitution of the identity of individuals and groups. Connection of emotions with education and moral life, both in the recognition of values or principles and in the contingent terrain of moral judgments in particular situations. Historical and phenomenological monograph on pride.

B. *Philosophy of action*. Prudential approach to practical rationality, which can be directed to both individual and collective action. Studies on the interpretation of action and the distinction between motives and causes of human actions, important topic for anthropology and moral philosophy.

C. *Phenomenology and anthropology of religions*. Fundamentally the contrast between phenomenology and philosophical anthropology of religious phenomena and the history and plurality of religions.

D. *Capabilities, human rights and global justice*. The notion of capabilities is used in development economics and in human development reports to assess well-being and quality of life. Work on the intercultural application of the notion of capabilities, the philosophical foundation of human rights and theoretical and practical problems of global justice.

E. *Theory of knowledge*. The general topic that interests me most is the relationship between scientific and philosophical knowledge. Sustained research on a particular issue: the conception of space in transcendental philosophy in the face of positive developments in geometry. In this research my interest in the philosophy of knowledge and my training in Physics converged. A book (PhD thesis) and some articles.
